# Sailing sucks!

Ask any teenager in my house and they'll tell you! They wouldn't have said anything different being out with us on the water last weekend but there is really very little nuance in saying that. Sailing was fine this past weekend but thankfully the RC called short races because good freaking grief was sailing also frustrating this past weekend!

## Fall something and something+1!

I'm feeling ornery and I'm not going to look up what numbers these races were. Take that crappy winds! Ha! That will show you!

So, ahem. I've said it at least twice, now, but I can repeat, if you like, that the winds weren't all that great Sunday. And I don't mean that there wasn't wind because HELL YEAH there was wind! The Myers wind station showed, in fact, very steady at ~20 (with little puffs to 25) for most of the afternoon. And they also showed a rock solid wind direction. So, well, if the wind was steady and from one direction then what the heck am I whining about???

Ah! Well, hey, please, let me inform you! The super solid and super steady winds were blowing directly from the west. 100% pure west, all the way. At least, at Myers (and my house, incidentally, which is not anywhere near Myers). But, like, whoa: geography. Indeed, hey, we have hills around here. The hills run pretty much north/south. And the wind was west. And our start line (and most of our marks) are on the west shore of the lake – in the lee of these freaking hills.

# Speaking of results...

Well, there were courses, sailed, on the lake. Both started north because the hills do a reasonable job of funneling the west wind down the lake (towards the south). For the first race we probably had marks only on the left (west) side and then for the second we went to **B**lue and then came back. Perhaps to **S**ycamore? Well, whatever! The first was sort of up/down except the winds were west and fluky and all over the place but the race was called north/south. The second race went over to the land-of-more-steady winds and then came back on a screaming reach (holy-freaking-cow screaming reach) that was a tiny bit broad then close then a bit tight then a beat and then squirrelly-as-all-get-out (as we moved closer to the leeward shore).

So the first race (number 7 in the series!) was kind of closer to traditional and was taken by *Snitch* then *Mehitabel* (sailed by a crack crew in Clare's absence). The second race had that long and insane reaching leg which allowed *Mojito* to take the crown quite handily (minutes corrected ahead of the nearest competitor – on a race that lasted barely an hour).

So, yes. October 17 is probably pretty much the end for sailing. There will still be opportunities to be on the water (and help) when we pull marks. And you'll still be able to see us at the end-of-year banquet/awards. But sailing will be done with for the year.
